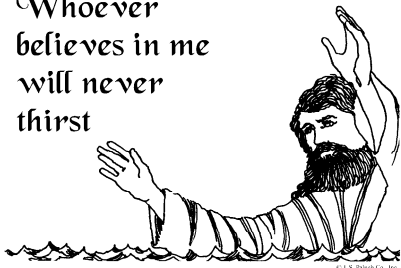

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I would like to share with you some thoughts as to why I believe that St. Paul was so effective in his ministry. He was raised in the cosmopolitan city of Tarsus, Cilicia, which is in modern day Turkey. Although St. Paul lived in the Jewish community of Tarsus, he was educated in Greek philosophy; and because of the status of his family, he was afforded Roman citizenship. He grew up experiencing these three great cultures.

When he answered, "Yes," to our Lord's invitation on the road to Damascus to become an Apostle, he brought to his ministry a unique set of gifts. As he wrote in one of his Letters, he was "...a Jews' Jew" with an intimate knowledge and appreciation of the Greek and Roman cultures. St. Paul was a brilliant man with unbelievable insight into truth of who the risen Christ was and what he came into the world to proclaim. Lastly, St. Paul's vision and insight was matched by his unfailing courage and conviction as he writes in his Letter to the Romans: "If God is for us, who can be against us?"
