

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week's reading from the Letter of Saint James reminds me of the story of the rich man and Lazarus, which is found in the Gospel of Luke.

In both passages, the rich are warned about becoming obsessed with the transitory blessings of the "good life." Material possessions are not evil in and of themselves, but they can blind us to the more important things in life. (By the way, have you seen the bumper sticker that reads: "The most important things in life are not things.")

Both James and Luke condemn the rich to the netherworld, not because of their wealth, but because of their indifference to the plight of the "Lazaruses" that they encountered during life.

While we may not be rich, our lives are more comfortable than the lives of many we meet. The warning to you and me is clear: if we ignore the needs of our brothers and sisters in this life, we will pay the price in the world to come.

Prepare to Save a Life!


