Priests Retirement Collection!

Currently, we have over forty retired priests in the Diocese of Oakland. With one hundred active priests over the age of 60 or older, the number of retired clergy will grow considerably over the next decade. In addition, thanks be to God, our retired clergy are living longer and continue to help at Masses. However, this increases the cost above projections that were made when the system was put in place a couple of decades ago. Also, priests who come to our Diocese from another one or religious orders to serve the people of Oakland do not bring their retirement benefits with them. They start with zero when they begin to minister here. After meeting with the Priests' Retirement Board in 2013, it was recommended to add this second collection which will be next weekend, September 24th and 25th. Thank you for your support!

From the Pastor



My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Welcome back from Summer vacation!

I want to begin the School year by strongly encouraging you to make weekly attendance at Mass a priority for you and your family. Let me tell you why I think that you need to do this. One of the central characteristics of our religion is our understanding of the importance of community. We are a communal religion. We live our faith in the context of relationship. We believe that one of the most important messages that Jesus came to share with us is that we are called to live as one family. Jesus did not die on the cross to save you and me individually; he died to save us collectively. It is not acceptable for a Catholic to say, "I don't need to go to church; I have a personal relationship with Jesus." Salvation for us is a communal experience.

Unfortunately, one of the consequences of original sin is that we have a false sense of the importance of "self." Because of sin, we are all inclined to believe what is false about ourselves and to deny what is true. But, St. Paul describes our true nature perfectly when he says, "we were made incomplete, we find our completeness in the Lord and each other." This is why we Catholics celebrate the sacraments: to remind ourselves of who we are.

The Eucharist is the central sacrament of our faith because it best epitomizes our belief and our need. When we participate in the Mass, we are making two statements: first, we are acknowledging that we are one with each other through our oneness with Jesus; second, we are also admitting that, although we know the first statement to be true, because of our false sense of "self," we don't live what we profess to believe.

The simple truth is this: we need to attend Mass frequently in order to develop the wisdom and courage necessary to live according to our true nature. The Mass is not an option to be experienced when we find it convenient; it is a necessity of life.

High School Youth Ministry And Confirmation!


