#### Today's Readings!

**First Reading** -- Those who honor and comfort their parents shall never be forgotten (Sirach 3:2-7, 12-14).

**Psalm** -- Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways (Psalm 128).

**Second Reading** -- You are called into one body: Bear with one another; forgive one another; let Christ's peace control you (Colossians 3:12-21 [12-17]).

**Gospel** -- Joseph rose, took the child and his mother, and fled to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23).

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are all very familiar with the accounts of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt as shared with us in the Gospel of Matthew. King Herod had hoped to have Jesus killed, but an angel warned Joseph in a dream about the planned assassination; and so they escaped.

I have two thoughts to share with you about this reading. First: every family, even the Holy Family, experiences unexpected difficulties and trying situations. As someone once said, "Life ain't no bowl of cherries." The crisis that confronted Mary and Joseph soon after the birth of Jesus shows us that even a close relationship with God will not protect us from the vicissitudes of life.

Second: the example of the Holy Family shows us that when we face trying times and trying situations, we must trust in our God. Mary and Joseph did not know what awaited them and their son in Egypt, but they believed that God would sustain them and he did. God never promised us a life free of troubles or tragedies, but he did assure us that we would never face them alone. The Holy Family models for us what it means to trust in God; they never doubted his presence in their lives. The God that cared for Mary, Joseph and Jesus is watching over our families. He will never abandon us; we will never be alone.

With confident assurance in the compassion of our God, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family
