## Exodus 19:3-8a, 16-20b

*Moses went up the mountain to God.  
Then the LORD called to him and said,

Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings  
and brought you here to myself.  
Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my

dearer to me than all other people,  
though all the earth is mine.  
You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.  
That is what you must tell the Israelites.”  
So Moses went and summoned the elders of the people.

*On the morning of the third day
