Through my sight and touch and sound in you and you in me?

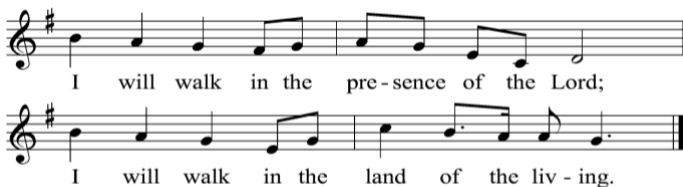
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## **Isaiah 50:5-9a**

"But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply,
