with Christ's own loving care.

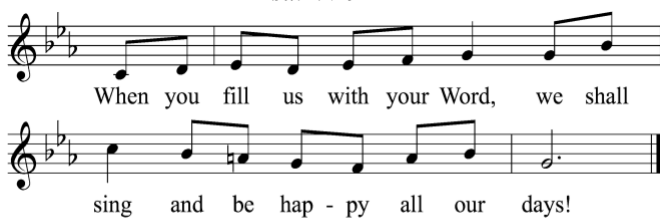
As one by one we poor are fed and one by one are healed,
