

Priests Retirement Collection!

Currently, we have over forty retired priests in the Diocese of Oakland. With one hundred active priests over the age of 60 or older, the number of retired clergy will grow considerably over the next decade. In addition, thanks be to God, our retired clergy are living longer and continue to help at Masses. However, this increases the cost above projections that were made when the system was put in place a couple of decades ago. Also, priests who come to our Diocese from another one or religious orders to serve the people of Oakland do not bring their retirement benefits with them. They start with zero when they begin to minister here. After meeting with the Priests' Retirement Board in 2013, it was recommended to add this second collection which will be next weekend, September 9th and 10th. Thank you for your support!





I have often said that the Lord's Prayer is one of the most dangerous prayers to offer to God. Most of us say it so

frequently that we fail to fully appreciate the implications of the words. When we say, "... forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, ..." we are opening ourselves up to God's justice or mercy.

We are all sinners in need of God's forgiveness, but God's ability to forgive us is conditioned by our willingness to forgive. God is so just that he will not impose his mercy on us unless we are fully accepting of it. Let me try to explain it this way: mercy is rooted in love and it can only be effective under certain conditions. If we harbor feelings of anger, resentment and hate towards others and we have no desire to change those feelings, we leave God no choice. Because of his respect for our freedom, he cannot impose on us that which we do not want. Mercy by its very nature can only exist in an environment of forgiveness and love. When we refuse to forgive others, we prevent God from forgiving us and we expose ourselves to his justice.

None of us can withstand the justice of God! Our choice is clear: if we want God's mercy, we must work at becoming merciful ourselves. Mercy begets mercy. So, I encourage you to pray the Lord's Prayer with care!
