As I watched:

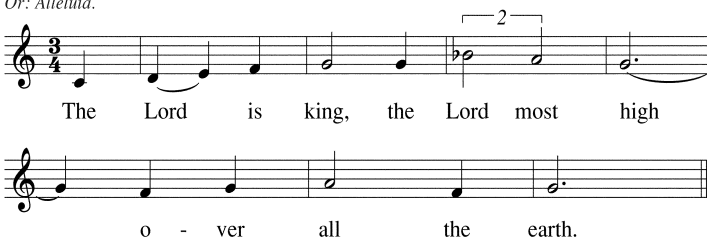
Thrones were set up and the Ancient One took his throne.
