All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

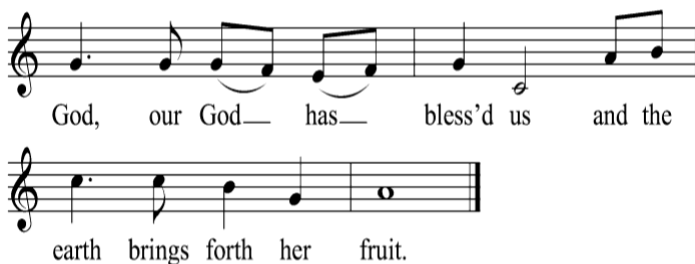
