

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday or Rejoice Sunday. We light the rose colored candle on the Advent wreath. The Presider at Mass has the option wearing rose colored vestments

Rejoice in the Lord always Of (although that won't happen here, pink is not my color). In the midst of this season of anticipation and preparation, we pause to Rejoice!

In the second reading, St. Paul writes: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near."

The coming of the Lord is near, but it can be a struggle to stay focused on the true significance of His arrival. If we are not careful, this can become a season in which we "rejoice" in the superficial and the material. It is easy to loose sight of what is holy and important.

In today's Gospel, the crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" John's advice is disarmingly clear and straightforward: Be generous. Be honest. Be compassionate. Be peaceful.

If we focus our attention on these simple virtues, we will be prepared to experience the true joy of this season. We will Rejoice in the Lord! And, He will Rejoice in us!
