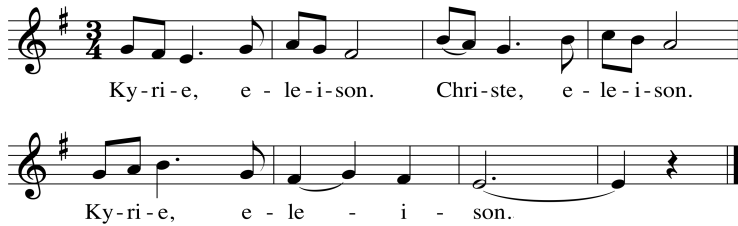
Beyond the days_ of hope and myst'ry
