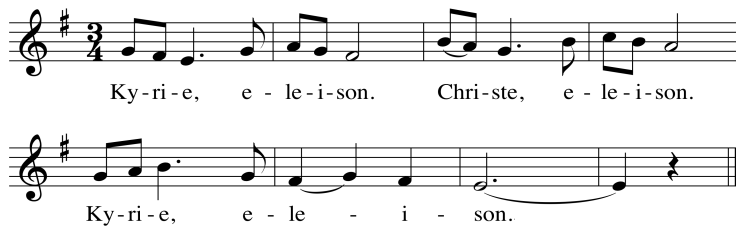

### Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

The Lord God took Abram outside and said,  
“Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can.  
Just so,” he added, “shall your descendants be.”  
Abram put his faith in the LORD,

smoking fire pot and a flaming torch, which passed between  
those pieces.

It was on that occasion that the LORD made a covenant with  
Abram, saying: “To your descendants I give this land,  
from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates.”
