Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

June 29, 2025

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The holy and brilliant Dominican, St. Thomas Aquinas, wrote, "*Grace builds on nature*." He taught that the grace of God does not supersede who we are as God's unique creations. Rather, the grace of God enhances our individual qualities so that we become our better selves and better disciples of our Lord.

Saints Peter and Paul, whose feast day we are celebrating this weekend, are dramatic examples of this truth.

The Gospels, Acts of the Apostles and Letters of Saint Paul give us a pretty good sense of the personalities and characters of these two pillars of Christianity. They were so instrumental in the development of the nascent Church established by Jesus Christ that they have the rare honor of having their feast day celebrated on a Sunday.

Saint Peter's personality could be best described as impulsive, indecisive and at times cowardly. We all recall his denial of Jesus in the early morning hours of Good Friday. But his saving grace was his humility. The Gospel of Matthew described the scene of Peter impulsively getting out of his boat and walking on the water toward Jesus; but he became afraid and as he began to sink he cried out, Lord, save me! When push came to shove, Peter had enough faith in Jesus to place his trust in him. In the Gospel of John (6:68-69), a despondent Jesus asked the apostles if they too were going to abandon him and Peter responded: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Peter probably didn't know exactly what he was professing, but he was humble enough to let God's grace work in and through him.

In contrast, Saint Paul was fearless, decisive and selfconfident to the point of arrogant. In his First Letter to the Corinthians (15:9), Paul describes himself as the least of the apostles and unworthy to be called an apostle, but he concludes the passage by stating: "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace in me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them..." I firmly believe that it was the exceptional confidence that Saint Paul had in the Lord and in himself that inspired him to travel over 10,000 miles preaching the Good News to the Gentiles.

This weekend as we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, let us reflect on our lives and how God's grace can enhance our nature.
