Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Lest we forget -- is an old fashioned way of insisting that we remember, both people and events. Jesus used it at the Last Supper: do this in memory of me, and we repeat his words at every Eucharist.

Let us not forget Pope Francis, who gave us an image of the papacy that revolved around his concern for the poor. It was an image that showed what real power is about: not military or economic aggression but true humility.

Francis reached millions by his love of those who were without a voice, who were abandoned and scorned. He gave us an image of what the church is really about: building bridges, not walls; opening to the world with questions, not dictating answers. Pope Leo seems to continue that work in the same way.

Let us also remember the horrors that continue daily in Gaza and Ukraine. War is the original sin of the human race, and it infects virtually the whole world. This country is at war despite the constitutional requirement that it be declared so by Congress.

As Jesus called us to remember him, we must do so as we see him tortured and killed by innocents here and abroad. Lest we forget.

Living God's Commands!

The first reading forms part of Moses' farewell discourse, a call to the people to return to God. It is not a legalistic summons; rather, it is an appeal to heart and soul. It outlines a command that is not impossible to follow, or too difficult to undertake, or too expensive. Look into your hearts, says Moses; there you will find what to do.

Paul sees Jesus Christ as the image of God, the agent of creation and preservation. We sense, in his words, things profound: "dominions or principalities or powers." But in the midst of that, Paul keeps his attention on Jesus Christ, head of the church. It is in Christ that we find fullness and reconciliation -- in the blood of the cross.

Luke's Gospel illustrates the double commandment of love with the story of the Good Samaritan. The story is a radical one, for it comes to focus on the question of who my "neighbor" is. That neighbor is not identified with any group, but rather by the scope of our compassion.
