During the month of November, we are encouraged to reflect on the reality of death. We begin the month by cele-

We all have questions about death and many of us prefer not to think about the subject at all; but, it is a topic that we can ill afford to ignore. 
World Mission Sunday & Catholic Home Mission Appeal!
