we shall arise at the sound of our name.

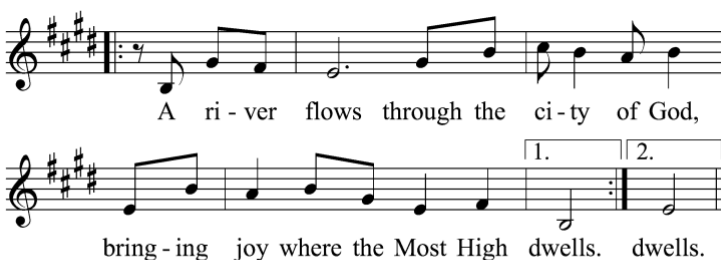
Not in the dark of buildings confining,
