Dear Brothers and Sisters,

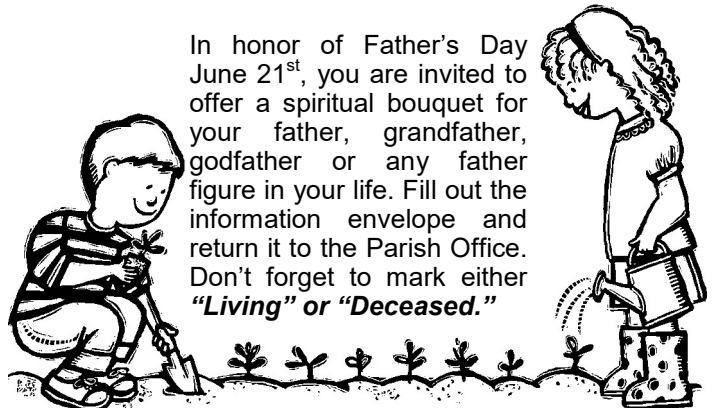
The title of Pope Leo's first message to the world tells it all: Magnifica humanitas. You don't need much Latin to understand that the pope is speaking of the glory of being human. That stands in contrast to the power and prevalence of technology and its machines. He is not downplaying the usefulness of technology but reminding us that our human powers, given us by God, remain paramount in our lives.

Specifically Pope Leo is referring to the large, even overstressed place being given to so called artificial intelligence in our everyday affairs. That AI is with us and here to stay cannot be denied. What the pope wants to make clear is that no mechanical device, however useful, can replace the role of human intelligence and inner powers in our work and our understanding.

The problem with AI is its concentration of power in areas of basic human endeavors: communication, education, families. The danger is very real that a few entities like corporations and finance will exert outsize influence over the lives of people, controlling instead of being controlled. The human capacity to direct the course of events must not be handed over to algorithms.

Above all, the human qualities of compassion, free will and conscience, given by God, cannot be replaced by mechanical devices. It will take patience and firmness to make clear our Christian conviction that the human must remain in control of what we do and have. For this message of the Holy Father we must be deeply grateful and take care that it guides what we think and do.
